

Xede Worker: Healthy strategy We keep in regular contact with our workers, to ensure they are fit and healthy to work. The government guidelines have been communicated and we have ensured that all workers have responded to this. We have then issued a certification of 'Covid Safe worker' to their profile to clearly identify that they have adhered to and understood the guidance.

All Xede consultants have been trained to use screening questions when engaging a worker. Should this identify any symptoms they will be asked to quarantine in line with the government guidance. (10 days if you have symptoms, however mild, seeking a test as soon as you can. 14 days if you live with someone who has symptoms, again encouraging them to have a test)

Our workers have been informed about following our clients' own plans & risk assessments. These will be shared with the worker in advance of their arrival at the school, where possible. They will be shared when they arrive where this is not possible.

The use of PPE is not mandatory in all schools at this stage, but again, Xede workers have been asked to follow the all guidelines as they are published or as requested on an individual client basis.



Our Clients: Clear communication

We will share all documentation with our clients to ensure they have confidence in using Xede workers.

We will ask clients to share their plans/risk assessments prior to booking to ensure workers can read and update themselves.

We will listen to clients' requests and implement any requests prior to booking.

We will supply the school with a signed risk assessment for each worker for each booking to outline what Xede has done to reduce the risks of infection.

			The most important symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19) are recent onset of any of the following: a new continuous cough a high temperature a loss of, or change in, your normal sense of taste or smell (anosmia) Wash hands more often than usual, for 20 seconds using soap and hot water, particularly after coughing, sneezing and blowing your nose, or after being in public areas where other people are doing so. Use hand sanitiser if that's all you have access to. To reduce the spread of germs when you cough or sneeze, cover your mouth and nose with a tissue, or your sleeve (not your hands) if you don't have a tissue, and throw the tissue in a bin immediately. Then wash your hands or use a hand sanitising gel. Clean and disinfect regularly touched objects and surfaces using your regular cleaning products to reduce the risk of passing the infection on to other people. Candidates should supervise students to ensure they wash their hands more often than usual. They should do so thoroughly for 20 seconds with running water and soap and dry them thoroughly or use alcohol hand rub or sanitiser ensuring that all parts of the hands are covered

Candidate classed as Vulnerable	Contracting infection and passing this on Additional risk to candidate welfare		The UK Government has issued advice stating that for those who are over 70, those who have an underlying health condition or those who are pregnant should: avoid contact with someone who is displaying symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19). These symptoms include high temperature and/or a new and continuous cough; avoid non-essential use of public transport, varying your travel times to avoid rush hour, when possible; work from home, where possible. avoid large gatherings, and gatherings in smaller public spaces such as pubs, cinemas, restaurants, theatres, bars, clubs; avoid gatherings with friends and family. Keep in touch using remote technology such as phone, internet, and social media; use telephone or online services to contact your GP or other essential services. be particularly stringent in following social distancing measures, initially for a period of around 12 weeks.
